When Princess Elizabeth became Her Majesty The Queen on 6 February 1952, few could have anticipated that she would go on to become Britain's longest-reigning monarch; a figure revered around the world for her wisdom, dedication and sense of duty.

St James's House has had the privilege of producing high-quality official publications for the Thames Diamond Jubilee Pageant, Her Majesty The Queen's 90th Birthday Celebration at Windsor, the RAF's centenary celebrations, the 75th anniversary of VE Day and the Royal Navy. Robert is the royal editor of the London Evening Standard, and royal contributor for NBS and Forbes magazine in the US, where he has been dubbed the "Godfather of Royal Reporting" by the Wall Street Journal.

THE BOOK LAUNCH



At St James's House we are committed to fresh and creative thinking and our events team always works closely with our project partners to ensure their vision becomes a reality. Each of our partners will be offered the opportunity to gain admittance to the VIP watch party marquee along The Mall, where they will receive Platinum Jubilee Pageant hospitality.

The marquee will also be the venue for the book's official unveiling and presentation, which will take place during the day. Attended by a select list of pageant guests, this presents an excellent high-level networking opportunity.

On the evening of the pageant, a second book launch will take place in Claridge's elegant art deco ballroom. In addition to the venue's famous levels of hospitality, our sponsors and attending dignitaries will be treated to a Q&A with royal authors Katie Nicholl and Robert Jobson, who will provide behind-the-scenes insights from the day's events.

- Members of the European and Commonwealth parliaments
- Government agencies
- Universities, colleges and schools across the UK and the Commonwealth.

The publication will also be promoted through *The Mail on Sunday* and will receive high-profile coverage in the form of a complimentary reader offer. Having run a similar offer for previous royal publications, we anticipate around 100,000 enquiries from *The Mail on Sunday*'s 1.5 million readership.
