Queen's Platinum Jubilee Medal



This e-mail provides members on the board of directors with important information regarding the Queen's Platinum Jubilee medal only a select number of provinces are distributing to approved nominees. This information will be important for you should anyone in your regions ask questions. Some of the awardees have only recently begun posting their photos of their medal and their award presentations on social media this past Sunday and Monday, and once I saw these I began investigating. The Chairman of the RCAF Association Board of Directors Colonel (Ret) Terry Chester, CD encouraged me to send this message to all of you. Please distribute widely, as you see fit:

- A scan of the Government of Canada heritage site (canada.ca) offers no explicit mention of any medal;
- This article from CBC news from 17 April 2022 makes it clear the medals on offer are the result of only
 a few provinces deciding since the Canadian government decided not to participate, that the select
 provinces would offer medals. It is to be noted that Ontario, Quebec and British Columbia have chosen
 not to participate https://www.cbc.ca/news/world/platinum-jubilee-medals-provinces-royal-visit-charles-camilla-1.6421391
- A visit to one or more provincial websites hints that initiatives involving a medal are something that is being organized not at the federal level, but at the provincial level. The Alberta website can be found here https://www.alberta.ca/queens-platinum-jubilee-medal.aspx

o There are 7,000 being made available in Alberta;

- MLAs, Indigenous leaders, and members of the Alberta Order of Excellence, receive the medal automatically;
- "Program partners" is a term that would appear to refer to organizations and entities entitled to nominate individuals to receive the medal;

- A broad range of program partners have been invited to submit nominations. These
 partners include Members of the Legislative Assembly, Indigenous organizations, the
 Canadian Armed Forces, various Protective Services and an array of non-governmental
 community-based organizations.
- The deadline for nominating in Alberta is 30 November 2022;
- o All medals must be distributed by 31 December 2022; and,
- The formal program ends on 5 February 2023.
- Nova Scotia has been allotted 5,000 medals. See the website here for more information https://novascotia.ca/iga/jubilee/jubilee-medal.asp
